Descriptive Essays consist of 4 paragraphs:

<u>Paragraph 1</u>: An introduction where you state what you are describing.

<u>Paragraphs 2+3</u>: Each of these should describe a different aspect of the subject

under consideration. Give the characteristics of the place being described.

Include details that will make your subjects come alive. It may include details

of location, geography, scenery, history, lifestyle, culture etc.

<u>Paragraph 4</u>: End with the conclusion. The conclusion is there to wrap up the description and provide final thoughts. State a general conclusion about the place.
